## Notes

The 'Section' category refers to land located in Sections 31-36 of Township 29 and Sections 2-18 of Township 30, Range 1, West of the Second Meridian owned by the Christian Community of Universal Brotherhood (CCUB) on which its members were residing communally.

The page from the original list containing the names of CCUB members residing on Sections 2-6 is lost and presumed destroyed. However, general information about these Sections is preserved in the original list as follows:

From 1928 to 1937, Doukhobors belonging to the CCUB also belonged to the Society of Named Doukhobors of Canada, an umbrella group created by Peter "Chistiakov" Verigin for the purpose of uniting all Doukhobor groups in Canada.
